5.	Mast, Rigging, and Sails (for sailboats)
	Condition of the mast and spreaders. Check the shrouds and turnbuckles. Condition of the mainsail and genoa (seams, wear). Inspection of the furling or windlass system. Check the mast step and fittings.
6.	Engine and Propulsion
	Check oil and coolant levels, and any possible leaks. Check for water mixed with oil (mayonnaise appearance).
	Cold and hot start, sound, and vibration test.
	Abnormal smoke? Cold , Running , Note color:
	Listen for unusual engine noises or vibrations.
	Condition of belts and hoses.
	Inspection of propeller and propeller shaft.
	Check anodes and transmission.
	Forward / reverse gear test.
	Check engine documentation (hours, maintenance logs).
	Check that maintenance and invoices are up to date.



7.	Electricity and Electronics
	Test the electrical panel and batteries.
	Test all electronics: GPS Plotter, depth sounder, VHF, autopilot, AIS, radar,
	antennas, etc.

	Check charger, alternator, and solar panels.

	General condition of the cabin, floorboards, upholstery, and woodwork.

	Check tanks (fresh water, fuel, black water).

	Inspect gas system (pipes, valves, locker).

	Check expiry dates of gas hoses.
