### **Remarks :**

The Pogo 12.50 is described in sailing circles as the perfect blend of performance and practicality. Built by Structures in France, the Pogo 12.50 is a testament to high-quality craftsmanship and is known for its ability to plane with ease, often reaching double-digit speeds. This particular boat has had only one owner since new, ensuring its history is fully known and documented. From the factory in Brittany, the owner sailed it to Tunisia where it was based for several years before being relocated to Poland, where it is now. This extensive journey is a testament to the boat's seaworthiness and reliability over long distances. Currently, the boat enjoys a more relaxed life, used only on weekends during the summer months. During the winter, it is carefully stored on the ground under a protective cover, a practice that helps preserve its condition and integrity against the elements. A significant point of confidence for any potential new owner is that the boat has never been chartered, meaning it has always been handled by a single, dedicated individual rather than being subjected to the wear and tear of multiple users. The interior, while designed with a spartan, functional aesthetic common in performance yachts, is surprisingly spacious, feeling more akin to a 45-foot vessel. This is due to its wide beam, which also contributes to the boat's stability and speed. For a discerning sailor who values a cruiser with the feel of a race boat and wants a vessel with a clear, well-maintained history, this Pogo 12.50 is an exceptional find.
