The 2010 Jeanneau Sun Odyssey 36i is a highly popular and well-regarded cruiser that strikes an excellent balance between sailing performance, comfort, and ease of handling. As a production yacht from a leading European builder, it benefits from modern construction techniques and a thoughtful design by naval architect Marc Lombard. The "i" in the model name stands for "injection molding," a process used on the deck that results in a lighter, stronger, and more environmentally friendly build.

Sailing Performance:

- Under Sail:** The 36i is a responsive and lively boat to sail. Its fractional rig, paired with a relatively high-aspect blade rudder, gives it excellent feel and control, even when heeled over.

- Ease of Handling:** The deck layout is simple and efficient, making it manageable for a single-handed sailor or a couple. Halyard and primary winches are well-placed, and the mainsheet is led to a winch on the coachroof, keeping the cockpit clear of clutter. The boat handles well under power, and its nimble nature makes manoeuvring in tight spaces a breeze.

Deck & Exterior:

- Cockpit:** The cockpit is one of the boat's best features—it's surprisingly spacious for a 36-footer. The walk-through transom and swim platform are excellent for swimming and boarding. You'll find good storage in the cockpit lockers, including a dedicated space for a life raft. The teak cockpit seating and sole add a touch of classic elegance.
- Deck:** The injection-moulded deck is a key selling point, providing a solid, clean finish. The non-skid is effective, and the general layout is easy to move around.

Interior:

The interior of the 36i is bright, airy, and well-finished. Jeanneau's use of light-colored woods and plenty of natural light from hull windows and hatches creates a welcoming atmosphere.

- Salon & Galley:** The main salon features a U-shaped dinette to starboard and a long settee to port, which can double as a sea berth. The galley is functional and well-laid-out, with a two-burner stove and oven, a deep double sink, and a large top-loading refrigerator.

- Cabins:** The three cabins offer generous double berths with good ventilation and storage. The aft cabin's are particularly spacious, benefiting from the boat's wide beam carried well aft.
