The layout is designed for practical use, with sufficient space for short stays on the water. <h3>Engine and Performance</h3>The Draco 2000 is equipped with a Volvo Penta B20 inboard gasoline engine from 2002. This engine has a power output of 130 hp, distributed over four cylinders, and is electrically started. The engine has approximately 1500 operating hours and is operational. The VAT has been paid, and a proof of ownership is present. The last time the boat was taken out of the water for maintenance and antifouling was in 2025. No signs of osmosis have been detected.<h3>Usage and Sailing Experience</h3>The Draco 2000 has been used for pleasure cruising and vacations on inland waters. The combination of a powerful engine, stable hull, and compact dimensions makes this boat suitable for both leisurely trips and fast sailing where permitted.
