The draft is 80 cm, and the clearance height is 150 cm, making the vessel suitable for various inland waters and lakes. The standing height inside is 100 cm, providing enough space for seated passengers and limited mobility for the skipper. The hull features a V-bottom shape, contributing to the stability and sailing characteristics of the vessel.<h3>Motorization and Technical Specifications</h3>The boat is equipped with a Perkins 6-cylinder diesel engine of 130 hp, built in 1953. This inboard engine is electrically started and consumes about 5 liters per hour. The engine was overhauled in 2015, during which the electrical installation was also addressed. The engine has approximately 500 operating hours and is powered by a diesel tank with a capacity of 300 liters. The cruising speed is around 25 km/h, with a maximum speed of 40 km/h. Onboard are various measuring instruments, including a fuel tank gauge, oil pressure gauge, temperature gauge, and tachometer. The electrical installation includes an alternator, voltmeter, and one battery, with a voltage of 220V.<h3>Interior and Equipment</h3>The interior of the boat is fully finished in solid mahogany and oak, providing a warm and classic appearance. The captain has a dedicated steering position with a steering wheel and dashboard. For the passenger area, there is a linen canopy with zip-out windows, including supports. This allows the boat to be used both open and covered, depending on weather conditions. The boat is equipped with a manual toilet with a closed drainage system. Outside, there are fenders and lines, as well as an anchor with a chain.<h3>Maintenance and Condition of the Vessel</h3>The boat is registered with the RDW under number 05-54-YR, and VAT has been paid. The year of construction is stamped in the wood (1952-1953), underscoring the authenticity of the vessel. The last antifouling treatment took place in 2020. The hull needs to be treated with antifouling again. Additionally, the fore and aft decks require attention, and the sides should be re-varnished. The boat was last taken out of the water for maintenance in 2025.<h3>Usage and Sailing Experience</h3>The Swiss taxi boat has been primarily used on lakes and for pleasure cruising. Due to its size and layout, the vessel is suitable for both private use and commercial purposes, such as tours or events. The boat is stable, offers plenty of space, and has a classic appearance that contributes to a unique sailing experience. The high sides and deep seating provide extra safety on board.<h3>History and Special Features</h3>After its active service as a taxi boat on Lake Zurich until around 1995, the vessel was transported to Berlin. In 1997, the boat was brought to the Netherlands. The combination of Swiss craftsmanship, a powerful engine, and a characteristic design makes this saloon boat a striking presence on the water. The smooth exterior finish is rare for this type of vessel and contributes to its unique appearance.<h3>Summary</h3>This Swiss taxi boat type 850 from 1952 is a characterful vessel with a rich history and a functional design.
