With a length of 6.50 meters and a width of 2.47 meters, this polyester V-hull cruiser offers a stable and comfortable sailing experience, combined with powerful motorization and a practical layout. This boat is an attractive choice for water sports enthusiasts looking for a compact yet versatile boat with character.

Performance and Motorization
Under the hood is a Volvo Penta inboard gasoline engine with a power of 175 hp, distributed over six cylinders. This engine provides a cruising speed of about 30 km/h and a top speed of up to 55 km/h, making the Fairline 21 Weekender suitable for both relaxing trips and more sporty sailing pleasure. The engine starts electrically and has approximately 1700 operating hours. The boat shifts smoothly and responds directly to the steering, contributing to a pleasant and controlled ride. The trim flaps do not work on this boat.

The fuel tank has a capacity of 173 liters, which is sufficient for longer trips without needing to refuel. The boat is equipped with various gauges, including a fuel gauge, oil pressure gauge, temperature gauge, and tachometer, so you always have insight into the engine's performance.

Interior and Onboard Comfort
Inside, the Fairline 21 Weekender offers a surprisingly spacious and functional layout. The headroom of 1.80 meters makes the interior accessible and comfortable, even for taller passengers. There are two sleeping places available, ideal for a weekend away or an overnight stay on board. The dining area is practically arranged and can easily be converted into a sleeping space.

The kitchen is equipped with a stove and a refrigerator, allowing you to easily prepare meals and keep drinks cool. A manual toilet is available, with direct discharge to open water. The water tank has a capacity of 70 liters, which is sufficient for basic amenities during a short stay on board.

Navigation and Electrical Equipment
The boat is equipped with various navigation instruments, including a depth gauge, fishfinder, compass, and log/speedometer. This makes navigating on different waters easy and safe. For the electrical installation, the boat is equipped with a 12V and 220V system, with shore power connection, battery charger, alternator, inverter, and voltmeter. Two batteries with a total capacity of 200 Ah provide sufficient power supply on board.

An electric bilge pump and a spark-free fan contribute to safety and comfort while sailing. The self-draining cockpit ensures that rainwater is automatically drained, simplifying maintenance.

Exterior and Equipment
On deck, the Fairline 21 Weekender is equipped with a swim platform with a swim ladder, outdoor shower, cockpit table, and comfortable outdoor deck cushions. The cockpit is well-organized and offers enough seating for several people. Navigation lights, horn, and windshield wipers are present for extra safety and visibility in less favorable weather conditions.

A manual anchor winch with line and an anchor are available for easy mooring or anchoring on open water. Fenders and lines are included, as well as a tarpaulin for protection during storage or transport.

Trailer and Transport Options
A TDS road trailer from 2003 is included with the boat, equipped with a license plate (WR-PS-23). The trailer is braked, has two axles, and a load capacity of 2030 kg. The trailer is equipped with a trailer winch, three rollers, and an extendable license plate with extra lighting for reversing. This makes transporting the boat easy and safe.

Suitable for Various Sailing Activities
The Fairline 21 Weekender is suitable for a variety of purposes, from sporty sailing trips to relaxing day trips or weekend stays on the water. Thanks to the powerful engine, comfortable interior, and practical equipment, this boat is a versatile choice for both novice and experienced water
