<h2>Shetland Family Four 536 ready for boating fun</h2><p>This Shetland Family Four 536 is a compact GRP motorboat that invites carefree enjoyment on inland waterways. With a length of approx. 5.37 metres and a beam of 2.02 metres, she is pleasantly easy to handle, yet offers surprisingly usable space for a day out cruising, fishing, or a short overnight stay. Her shallow draft of around 0.27 metres also makes her suitable for shallower lakes, canals and quiet creeks. Anyone looking for a trailerable motorboat with an outboard engine, wheel steering and a practical layout will find this Shetland an appealing candidate within a Boatauction auction.</p><p>The current owner also shares a personal piece of history: he took over the boat from a friend who passed away. That gives her story a warm meaning, fitting for a boat meant to create memories. She has been used on inland waters for day trips, with the best moment being waking up on glassy water at sunrise. That perfectly captures what this Family Four 536 stands for: simple enjoyment close to home, with the comfort of a small cabin.</p></h3>Shetland Family Four 536 now in the online auction. Everyone can bid up to and including 24 August 2026.</h3><h3>What makes this Shetland suitable for day trips?</h3><p>She is built for relaxed use and easy handling. Thanks to the wheel steering outside, the boat feels familiar and easy to overseeâ€”ideal for those who like to cruise seated in the cockpit with good all-round visibility. The cockpit tent and cockpit table make time on board extra comfortable, whether you want shelter in changeable weather or simply want to linger longer at the dock. With the swim ladder, taking a refreshing dip or climbing back on board is easily arranged, which also makes her great for summer outings.</p></h3><h3>What about sleeping and comfort on board?</h3><p>The Shetland Family Four 536 offers two fixed berths. With an interior headroom of approx. 1.42 metres, it is a compact cabinâ€”appropriate for her sizeâ€”yet practical for a short overnight stay or a rest during a long day on the water. A manual toilet is on board. The toilet discharge goes directly to open water; this is important information for buyers who cruise in areas with specific regulations or who may wish to modify this to their own preferences. There is no heating, making her primarily a pleasant choice for the boating season and mild conditions.</p></h3><h3>Which engine is fitted and what can you expect?</h3><p>She is equipped with one Mercury outboard engine: a 2-stroke 40 hp long-shaft with electric start. This power suits a boat of this size well and is popular with enthusiasts looking for a lively, light motorboat for inland waters. Instruments on board include a fuel tank gauge and tachometer, keeping things clear underway. The engine is stated to be operational. Those searching for â€œShetland Family Four 536 with Mercury 40 hpâ€ or â€œGRP motorboat with outboard and electric startâ€ will recognise this as a practical, well-known combination.</p></h3><h3>How is she equipped for power and accessories?</h3><p>The electrical system is set up for 12V and there are two batteries on board with a total capacity of 200. There are also provisions such as a battery charger, alternator, inverter and shore power connection. The included inverter is a 1000W 12-to-220 solution, useful for running small appliances when you are not connected to shore power. She is also prepared for anchoring: two anchors are included, including an umbrella anchor and a Delta anchor, plus anchor line with chain. This makes it easy to find a quiet spot for a break, a fishing moment or lunch on board.</p></h3><h3>When was she last taken out of the water?</h3><p>The boat was last taken out of the water in 2025 for maintenance, and the antifouling treatment was also carried out that same year. It is stated that there is no osmosis or signs of osmosis present. These are relevant points for anyone specifically looking for a GRP boat with recent antifouling and a clear maintenance history regarding haul-outs.</p></h3><h3>Is a trailer included and what condition is it in?</h3><p>A road trailer with registration is included in

the sale: a Kalf trailer with registration WR-ZZ-42. The trailer is unbraked, has one axle and six rollers, and is fitted with a trailer winch. The condition of the trailer is described as poor: the rollers need replacing and the overrun brake does not work. The owner indicates that the trailer mainly served as a storage trailer for them. For buyers specifically searching for [Shetland with trailer](#) or [trailerable boat](#), this is an important point: the trailer is included, but will require work to make it suitable again for regular road transport.

This Shetland Family Four 536 is therefore an inviting choice for anyone looking for a compact cabin boat for inland waters, with an operational Mercury 40 hp outboard, practical cockpit equipment and the option to store her on a trailer. She is ready to give a new owner those calm mornings and relaxed cruising days that make this type of boat so popular.
