- Standing rigging in stainless steel replaced in 2000;
- Hull refastened below the waterline in 2000;
- Complete electrical system overhauled with a new electrical panel in 2005;
- New windlass installed in 2005;
- Webasto heating system;
- Renewed upholstery;
- Interior varnish on teak and mahogany restored.

The yacht is currently ashore, allowing for a thorough inspection of the hull and underwater works.
