Hatteras 32 Sport Fly with Spacious Flybridge
The 1984 Hatteras 32 Sport Fly is a characterful fibreglass motorboat with a practical layout, a sporty appearance and Hatteras's renowned American build quality. She combines a compact length of 9.60 metres with a generous beam of 4.00 metres. As a result, the boat offers remarkably spacious accommodation on board, while her relatively short length makes her easy to manoeuvre and moor. Her draft is approximately 1.00 metre, making her suitable for a variety of cruising areas. This Hatteras was designed for relaxing days on the water, enjoyable weekend trips and longer coastal excursions. Her flybridge provides an additional steering position and offers a superb view while underway. Below deck, she has a pleasant living area with a headroom of approximately 2.00 metres. The combination of space, speed and sheltered accommodation makes her an appealing motorboat for recreational use, coastal cruising and relaxing stays on board.

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Why is this Hatteras interesting?
The Hatteras 32 Sport Fly stands out for her spacious layout and solid appearance. She has a V-shaped hull, a single rudder system and external steering. The flybridge adds an extra dimension to the cruising experience, while the swimming platform with swim ladder provides easy access to the water. Thanks to her beam, the boat feels stable and spacious, both in the cockpit and in the interior. The owner used her at sea for day trips and weekend stays. A special memory consists of cruises along the islands of Capraia and Elba. This suits the character of this model well: she is suitable for relaxed cruising, while her speed also provides sufficient reserve for longer passages.

What accommodation is available on board?
Inside, the boat can accommodate four people, with two fixed berths and two additional sleeping places. The saloon has a dining area and mattresses, making her suitable for overnight stays and multi-day cruises. For extra comfort, air conditioning, a refrigerator, microwave and shower are available. The electric toilet does not discharge directly into open water. The living area is practically arranged for use during weekends and holidays. Her interior provides ample opportunity to dine indoors, relax and shelter in less favourable weather. Outside, the flybridge, cockpit and swimming platform provide additional living space. The available exterior cushions and bimini contribute to comfort on sunny days.

What engines does the boat have?
The Hatteras is powered by two Caterpillar 3208 DIT diesel engines. Both are installed inboard and feature electric starting. Each engine delivers 304 hp and has eight cylinders. The starboard engine has been overhauled and, according to the information provided, has approximately 60 operating hours. The port engine has been inspected and is listed with approximately 1,800 operating hours. Both engines are operational.

The stated cruising speed is approximately 14 kilometres per hour, while she can reach a maximum speed of around 24 kilometres per hour. Fuel consumption is stated at approximately 40 litres per hour, and the total diesel tank has a capacity of approximately 1,000 litres. On board, there is a fuel gauge, oil pressure gauge, temperature gauges and tachometers, among other equipment. For a prospective buyer, it is advisable to personally assess the operation, starting procedure and performance of both Caterpillar engines during a viewing and sea trial.

What nautical equipment is available?
For navigation, she is equipped with an autopilot, compass and VHF radio. The electrical installation includes a battery charger, alternator, inverter, voltmeter, shore power connection and solar panel. There are two batteries with a combined capacity of 270 Ah. The system operates on 12 and 220 volts. For anchoring, one anchor with chain is available, operated by a hydraulic windlass. The exterior equipment further consists of a bimini, pulpit and stern seats, stainless-steel guardrails, fenders, mooring lines, a crane, swimming platform and swim ladder.

Safety equipment includes a lifebuoy, liferaft, electric bilge pump and self-draining cockpit. A trailer or dinghy is not included in this lot.

What is the technical and cosmetic condition?

According to the information provided, the boat is in reasonable condition. She was taken out of the water for maintenance in 2026, and antifouling was applied in the same year. No indications or traces of osmosis have been reported. The fibreglass hull and V-shaped bottom provide a solid basis for further use.

It has been noted that the condition of the windows and window glass should be checked. A viewing is therefore important in order to assess the glazing, seals, interior finish and all technical systems personally. As with any used boat of this age, maintenance and possible modifications according to the owner's preferences may form part of future ownership.

What is included in the sale?

Documentation is available for the Hatteras, including a certificate of tonnage and engine documentation. The boat weighs approximately 8,710 kilograms. Her combination of two Caterpillar diesel engines, a spacious flybridge, comfortable accommodation and a relatively short hull length makes her attractive to enthusiasts of classic Hatteras motorboats.

She can accommodate family and friends, has an inviting swimming platform and, thanks to her wide hull, is well suited to both day trips and weekend stays.
